WHAT TYPES OF DATA ARE PROCESSED?

1) Navigation data

The computer systems and software procedures used to operate this website acquire, during their normal operation, some personal data whose transmission is implicit in the use of Internet communication protocols. This information is not collected to be associated with identified interested parties, but by their very nature could, through processing and association with data held by third parties, allow users to be identified.

This category of data includes the IP addresses or domain names of the computers used by users connecting to the site, the URI (Uniform Resource Identifier) addresses of the requested resources, the time of the request, the method used to submit the request to the server, the size of the file obtained in response, the numeric code indicating the status of the response given by the server (success, error, etc.) and other parameters relating to the operating system and the user's IT environment.

These data is used only to obtain anonymous statistical information on the use of the site and to check its correct functioning and are deleted immediately after processing. The data could be used to ascertain responsibility in case of hypothetical computer crimes against the site.

The legal basis of the processing is the legitimate interest of the Data Controller in the technical management of the site's functionality and security.

2) Data provided by the user

The optional, explicit and voluntary sending of electronic mail to the addresses indicated on this site or through the specific contact form, involves the subsequent acquisition of the address of the sender, necessary to answer the requests, as well as any other personal data included in the message. specific summary information will be progressively reported or displayed on the site pages set up for particular services on request.

3) Cookie

Like practically all websites, ours also uses some cookies. Cookies are small text files that the sites visited by the user (but also other websites or web servers) send and record on his computer (or mobile device), to then be retransmitted to the same sites (or web servers), on the next visit of those, thus sending information.

Cookies are now fundamental tools as they allow modern sites to function at their best, allowing maximum customization, interaction and fluidity in navigation. But they can also be used to monitor user browsing and then send advertising messages in line with those.

Cookies might be:

- *Session cookies* (if they expire when the browser is closed) or permanent (they remain until the end of a term, even years);
- *First-party cookies* or *third-part cookies* (in this second case they are set by a site or by a webserver different from the one the user is visiting at that moment);
- *Technical cookies* (necessary, sometimes essential, for a complete - or better - use of the site) or profiling (aimed at creating a user profile, to then send advertising messages in line with the preferences shown by the same during the previous navigation).

The Data Protection Authority considers technical cookies as session cookies, functionality cookies and - only under certain conditions - analytics cookies; in particular the Data Protection Authority, in the provision of 8 May 2014, specified that the latter can be assimilated to technical cookies only if used for the purpose of optimizing the site directly by the owner of the site itself, which can collect information in aggregate form on the number of users and how they visit the site.

In particular, you have the right to request access to the data concerning you, their correction or deletion, the integration of incomplete data, the limitation of processing; to receive data in a structured , commonly used and machine-readable format ; to oppose in whole or in part to the use of the data, as well as to exercise the other rights recognized to you by the applicable discipline.

According to the art. 77 of the Regulation, moreover, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the Data Protection Authority in the event that it considers that the processing violates the aforementioned Regulation.
